

## **Noémie Aubert Bonn**

Noémie is a postdoctoral researcher at Hasselt University (Belgium), where she conducts research on research assessment and research culture, and a Research Associate at the University of Manchester, where she works on open and reproducible research. She is originally from Québec (Canada), where she studied cognitive neurosciences and psychiatry, but she quickly became uneasy with the pressure to publish and the competitive atmosphere in academia.

In an attempt to address these issues, Noémie undertook a PhD at Hasselt University, during which she explored different stakeholders' perspectives on the impact of research assessments on research practices and integrity. Her postdoctoral research continues in this area, complemented by her participation in the SOPs4RI project from 2021 to 2023—a European Commission initiative aiming to develop a toolbox to help research institutions and funders establish procedures and environments that promote research integrity (https://sops4ri.eu/meet-our-team/).
