Dr Simon Kolstoe is Associate Professor of Bioethics at the University of Portsmouth, UK, and a trustee of the UK Research Integrity Office (UKRIO). He specialises in research ethics and integrity, with a particular focus on medical and defence research.

He chairs several prominent UK research ethics committees, including those for the UK Health Security Agency, the Ministry of Defence, and a Phase 1 National Health Service Research Ethics Committee. He also conducts ethics reviews for the European Commission and NATO.

Dr Kolstoe's academic journey began in pre-clinical drug discovery (BSc in Biomedical Science and PhD in Biochemistry, University of Southampton), before transitioning into bioethics (BA in Philosophy, Open University; MA in Research Ethics, Keele University), driven by a commitment to improve research governance and ethical oversight. His extensive experience positions him as a leading authority in promoting ethical standards and integrity within the research community. From 2018 to 2023, he also participated in the EU COST Action "EVBRES".
